Performances

Since our Scarborough Civic Centre performance we have had quite a few shows. Many in nursing homes or Senior Citizen Centres: two more in the summer and, starting in October, a series of concerts arranged by our President and Business Manager. Readers of the previous newsletter may remember that we got an Ontario Seniors Community Grant to hold a free show to attract new members. Although we worked hard, placing flyers and spreading the word, we only got a few visitors and none of them actually joined the Chorus.

Orton Beaumont decided that if they don't come to us, then we would go to them and he applied for another Ontario Seniors Community Grant, to allow us to visit other venues.
