

The main job of a chorus member is, of course, to learn the songs and perform them well, but many of us also have other duties and we would like to begin introducing these people to you.

FIRST, HOW DO WE GET OUR MUSIC?

We all know that Wyatt Gill creates the beautiful and intricate arrangements of the songs we sing. He writes this by hand, so in order for us to get the nicely printed sheets with music and text, as well as the PDFs and sound files on our website, someone has to weave some magic.


For many years that someone has been Don Gill, recently with the assistance of Sandy Hale. Originally, from 1994, Don worked with a computer program called "Music Time", but upgraded to "Sibelius 7" in 2008. This program helps with the transformation from hand-written to printed sheet (digitalizing the material), but it doesn't make it easy.

This is what a Sibelius work sheet for four voices looks like (below). Note that DCAT has from six to eight voices!



Also remember that a computer keyboard just has letters, numbers and a few signs (like # and \$); there are no notes on it, so everything on the music sheet has to be created using the Sibelius' menus.

The menu on top of the picture above is worth studying:

And this is only the "Layout menu". There are **nine** more menus. In order to work with the program, you need to use the Manual, all **730 pages** of it!

This becomes just about the steepest learning curve you can imagine. It is only possible to remember the basics; you have to resort to the massive Manual to look up most items as you encounter them. Inserting the notes is fairly straight-forward, but how do you make whole notes, quarter notes, triplets? How do you mark tempo and dynamics (forte, pianissimo, etc.)? Major and minor keys? etc. etc.

Then you have to type in the text and print out the score for each voice (from contrabass to soprano, as well as the full score (for Wyatt and Rick Dixon), and also learn to export sound files that can be used on our website or CDs, so that everyone can practice at home.

The amount of work involved is unbelievable and there are chorus members who have tried their hand at it and failed. Hats off to those who are making a go of it, Don Gill and Sandy Hale!
